HOW TO GET TO LISBON

By plane

Land at the Lisbon international airport which is just a mere 7 km from the centre of the city. Served by the main international airlines and just 3 hours away from the main European capitals, it is very easy to reach.

There are several good websites to book your flights to Lisbon, like <u>Budget Air</u>, <u>TAP Portugal</u> and <u>Skyscanner</u>.

In Lisbon, you'll land at Humberto Delgado airport. Until May 2016, the airport's official name was Lisbon Portela Airport or Aeroporto da Portela. You'll find that most locals still talk about Portela when referring to the airport. Terminal 1, near the main building, is the terminal for BA, TAP, and Vueling, while Ryanair and EasyJet connect to Terminal 2. That means traveling by bus to the main building.


The Lisbon Airport has a Metro (subway) station with a direct line to the city centre. For more info click here.

By train

Regional and inter-regional trains are used for short distances and make frequent stops. They complement the long distance services, connecting regional destinations with larger cities, such as Lisbon and Porto. Intercidades (InterCity) trains connect all major towns and cities in Portugal.

HOW TO GET TO BACK FROM CADIZ

By plane

There are two international airports located close to Cadiz: Jerez (Airport Code XRY) and Seville (Airport Code SVQ). Both airports have several daily connecting flights to the rest of Spain and Europe.

Check websites in your country that compare different airlines for flying with the best deal, like <u>Skyscanner</u>.

There are trains from Cadiz to the airport. For more information visit Renfe webpage.

By train

Spain has a large rail network and it is very easy to get from Cadiz, and you can easily purchase your train tickets online.

The train station of Cadiz is called Estación de Cádiz. It is located opposite the harbor, near the city center. If you are connecting from a flight to Jerez, Malaga, or Seville and you can also travel by train from all of Spain's major cities. The journey time from Cadiz to Jerez is only about 40 minutes, to Seville is around 90 minutes while traveling to Malaga takes around 4 hours. All trains are provided by Renfe.
